



This was Hastings' 5th in-person Repair Cafe, since our start in 2019.

The Hastings Repair Cafe is part of an intervillage community effort known as the *Rivertowns Repair Cafe* – its organized by volunteers from Hastings, Dobbs Ferry, Irvington, Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow.

Repair Cafés are free community-centered workshops where people bring consumer products that are in need of repair, working with volunteer fixers to repair these broken or faulty products. The central ethos of a Repair Café is to keep items out of landfills, share skills, and build community!

The Repair Café was initiated by Martine Postma in the Netherlands. Since 2011, the Repair Café Foundation, a non-profit organization, has provided professional support to local groups around the world wishing to start their own Repair Café.
